CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK a message to all residents

Coronavirus appears highly infectious.

Take every precaution to ensure you are spreading only kindness.

Whenever possible maintain a 2 metre (6 feet) separation from others.

Wash your hands regularly

The Parish Council would like to assure all residents that in this time of uncertainty and unexpected change you are not alone. The Parish Council and other local voluntary groups and organisations are providing support through our local Coordination Hub run by One Community at Kings Community Church in Hedge End.

Botley Neighbourcare, All Saints Church, the Hamble Valley Rotary Club, some Parish Councillors and Parish Office staff together with other groups and many individuals are working to help residents and their families during this difficult time. A key objective is to connect offers of help with those who need help during the current emergency.

The support offered includes:

 A delivery service for food shopping and other essentials and collection of medicines for those without support from family or friends.

- People with serious health conditions irrespective of age.
- Those who have been advised to selfisolate (people over 70, those receiving annual flu vaccination on medical advice and pregnant women or for other reasons)
- People displaying Coronavirus symptoms in self-isolation
- Social support for those needing someone to talk to by phone during the period of isolation.

Hedge End Food Bank: Kings Community Church, Upper Northam Rd, Hedge End SO30 4BZ. Food Parcels can be collected Monday and Thursday 10am - 1.30pm, drive-through style service. Clients will receive pre-packed food parcels containing very basic essentials, as stocks are already running low.

To obtain a food parcel you will need to have an official referral from a professional body such as housing dept, support worker, Jobcentre etc. Checks will be carried out upon arrival so please have any paperwork available to support your needs.

Donations: all the food has been generously donated by those in our local community, churches, businesses and our close friends at M&S Hedge End. To make a donation come when we are open. We also have donation trolleys located at the food hall entrance of M&S and at the Co-op in Hedge End village. 

THE END OF THE INITIAL PHASE

From the numerous responses to the various surveys and meetings held between 2016 and now, the Botley Neighbourhood Plan Committee created a draft Vision & Objectives for the Botley Neighbourhood Plan. This draft had 20 Objectives and 59 Community Aspirations.

Following further comments received on this draft some modifications of the existing Aspirations were made and to 6 new Aspirations created.

The information that helped shape the Vision & Objectives can be found in the Evidence Base on the Neighbourhood Plan tab. 15 Papers in the Evidence Base have generated 132 Aims, which can be found on the Botley web site on the Neighbourhood Plan tab in the Evidence Base or by using the following in your web

All this information produced by you and the Botley Neighbourhood Plan Committee will provide the basis of the evidence required to support the policies in the Botley Neighbourhood Plan.

Together with our professional advisers (Plan-et) we will now produce the first skeleton draft of the Botlev Neighbourhood Plan, setting out policies to achieve the Objectives; that is, things that can be achieved through the planning process. We will plan to move forward with the Aspirations, but please remember achieving these will require community engagement in the work required to act on each Aspiration.

The Neighbourhood Botley Plan Committee are hopeful of having a draft of the full Botley Neighbourhood Plan ready to publish for public comment by June this year. At the same time this draft will be submitted to Eastleigh Borough Council for screening, which is part of the formal process required before preparing the consultation document. A formal consultation with the community and other interested parties to fulfil Regulation 14 will probably take place around September 2020.
