Botley Bypass News


Botley experiences high volumes of through traffic using the A334 Botley High Street and the possibility of a road to bypass the village has been under discussion for many years.

In the summer of 2016 Hampshire County Council held three public exhibitions to showcase plans for the proposed Botley Bypass, as well as displaying plans in the local library. Over 730 local residents attended the exhibitions and 501 questionnaires were completed - of which 82 per cent supported the principal that Botley should have a Bypass. In November 2017 Hampshire County Council's proposed scheme for a brand new 1.8 kilometre single carriageway road was finally granted formal planning approval.

The Bypass will divert traffic from the main A334 through Botley, north from Maypole roundabout onto an improved Woodhouse Lane, and then south east onto the new Bypass running to the south of the railway line - which would then re-join the A334 at the junction near to Pinkmead Farm. Approximately 80% of traffic currently passing through Botley is non-local through traffic. This traffic will be encouraged to divert onto the Bypass. The scheme will provide opportunities for major improvements in the High Street, which will be based around a traffic calming scheme.

The road will cost an estimated £26 million and last month it was announced that the Government had awarded £10 million towards the project following a joint formal funding application from the County and Borough Councils. Developer contributions and County Council capital grants will make up the balance. Ground surveys, environmental mitigation work and land acquisitions can now go ahead in the area, to enable detailed designs to be finalised.

The County Council's Executive Member for Environment and Transport, Councillor Rob Humby, said: "The Bypass has been a long-standing ambition for local residents, and the County and District Councils and I am very pleased that the significant work we have put into developing a scheme has now paid off. It will dramatically improve quality of life in the area by removing through traffic from the village, reducing noise and making a major contribution to improving local air quality. The Bypass will also provide extra capacity to cope with the proposed increase in traffic in the area over the coming years."



Plans for a new 2-form entry primary school at Boorley Park have been submitted to the County Council. The plans consist of a two-storey building with a single storey kitchen/plant room attached, grass sports pitch and hard courts and a staff car park.

I've also been looking at how people find out about the different activities, services and resources in the area and with this in mind I am working on a project to produce a Parish Council community information guide, designed to collect all of the local relevant information on services and resources together in one place.

As Boorley Park grows I will be working with residents and exploring ways to help them share in the development of new community facilities.

I also receive regular information about local events, training, resources etc which I can share with you. I am available to offer advice and support to groups or help with the development of ideas for new community activities and projects.


Volunteers to use their own cars to transport a wide variety of clients to medical appointments, dentists, opticians etc. Others help with small DIY jobs like changing light bulbs.

Community SpeedWatch

Speeding is an issue which is recognised as a major concern for many residents; this makes it one of the biggest community priorities for the Police.

Hampshire Constabulary can work with volunteers to set up Community SpeedWatch groups which enable members of the community to become police support volunteers and take action, helping to educate drivers and thus make their neighbourhoods safer places.

The community scheme can only take place in 20 mph and 30 mph limits or zones and although managed by local police neighbourhood policing teams, it is run by volunteers.

Volunteers use equipment that can monitor the speed of passing traffic and then record the details, later adding them to a database. Vehicle checks are then undertaken by the police and letters are then sent to the registered keepers advising them of their speed and reminding them of why it is a community concern.

Please note that Community SpeedWatch is an educational scheme, not enforcement. It is considered as the first tier response to speeding issues. If a problem persists, it can be escalated to tier two, meaning that enforcement can be undertaken by the police neighbourhood policing teams.

Hampshire Police would like to run SPEEDWATCH in BOTLEY to help prevent speeding and want your help.

PARISH COUNCIL GRANT OPENS NEW CHAPTER FOR SCHOOL LIBRARY

Each year Botley Parish Council allocates a grant fund that community groups can access. This year the Friends of Botley School (FOBS) asked for support in the forthcoming move of the school's library to a new dedicated space.

The School had obtained money for building work but there was none available for the sort of improved resources and imaginative décor that helps inspire children and encourage a real love of reading. FOBS were delighted, therefore, when they were successful in an application to Botley Parish Council for funds towards new seating, display units, a rug and decorations. These complemented additional funding FOBS had raised for specialist books and new stock, including some from a sponsored read by the children.

In July the library was packed up and over the summer the building work was completed and the library furniture was relocated. It took a few weeks to shelve the books and reorganise the space but by the beginning of October the new library was ready to open.

The end result is a fantastic, fresh new space, a reinvigorated stock with many new, exciting and

engaging books plus a more inviting and comfortable user-friendly library. The children love the new space and the new rugs and relaxed seating proved an instant success. As the picture shows the school library is crucial to children's joy in reading and should be an inspirational space at the heart of the school for a long time to come.

Over the past three years FOBS has been fundraising for an Outdoor Classroom, in addition to the other



items of regular support. Receiving the necessary permissions to build the classroom was a long drawnout process, involving local authorities and even the Department of Education.

FOBS donated over £20,000 for the Outdoor Classroom to be built. This included the purchase and construction of the classroom, and having the necessary electric, heating, air handling and alarm systems installed to make this a year-round facility. A huge thank you to everyone who has supported FOBS events over recent years - your support is really appreciated and we are so proud to have funded this fantastic facility, which will be a huge benefit, enhancing the children's learning in so many ways whilst allowing more teaching sessions to be held in the great outdoors.

On Wednesday 13 December 2017 the Reverend Gregg Mensingh blessed the classroom and Mr Kevin Barton, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, cut the ribbon. The School Councillors made the most of the opportunity to have a good look at their new classroom. Also present at the opening ceremony were James and Alison Potter from 'The Linked In Man', and Paul and Mel Williams, who had all very kindly donated money specifically towards the Outdoor Classroom.
