#### BOTLEY CONFRONTS HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

Botley Parish Council is at the forefront of the drawing up of a crucial Neighbourhood Plan for Botley Parish, which will enable local people to have a say on the future development of Botley, in particular new housing.

The Botley Parish has approximately 2200 houses at present. A further 2500 houses are either being built, or have been approved in some way, more than doubling the size of the Parish, and it is clear these will have a massive impact on local infrastructure and services. Therefore, local residents are concerned particularly that with no Local Plan in place for the Borough of Eastleigh that would control further increases in housing development and locate it in other local communities who might be able to accept and accommodate these proposed new developments. At present developers are putting forward a number of new housing proposals around Botley that will severely impact upon local roads, the green gap between Botley and the surrounding towns and villages, and local services. These would have a detrimental effect on Botley and effectively destroy any sense of community in Botley.

The Botley Neighbourhood Plan will be produced later this year and will firmly oppose such speculative housing developments. It is hoped that Eastleigh Borough Council will come up with its own Local Plan, so that the two Plans might stop these unwelcome housing proposals. Botley needs to hear the opinions of the local community on all this. A full consultation will be announced in the near future, but in the meantime more information can be obtained by contacting the Parish Council office on 01489 787181.

#### Villagers start planning for the future as Botley experiences building boom

A BLUEPRINT for the future of a south Hampshire village is being drawn up

and serious concerns about the pace of development.

Botley Parish Council (BPC) is keen to create a Neighbourhood Plan as it will give residents more control over development around their village.

A Neighbourhood Plan is far-reaching blueprint, produced by the community, for the community, that sets out where local residents would prefer development to take place.

for the community, that sets out where local residents would prefer development to take place.

The document, which is approved or rejected following a referendum, usually contains local policies on parking, traffic, conservation, building styles and recreation, making it a scaled-down version of a Local Plan.

The Parish of Botley has around 2,220 houses but that figure is likely to double over the coming years as plans for more than 2,500 are in the pipeline.

And with Eastleigh Borough Council currently updating its Local Plan, many villagers fear that developers will take advantage by putting forward proposals for even more housing.

"The Botley Neighbourhood Plan will be produced later this year and will firmly oppose such speculative housing developments," said a spokesperson for BPC.

"Botley needs to hear the opinions of the local community on all of this.







# The Botley Neighbourhood Plan urgently needs your help



Neighbourhood Planning was introduced by the Localism Act (2011). A Neighbourhood Plan (NP) outlines the vision of the local community over a 10-20 year period and as part of this puts in place planning policy to guide future development. It cannot over-rule the strategic development policies in Eastleigh Borough Council's Local Plan, but it can influence these. As well as housing development a NP may deal with a wide range of social, economic and environmental issues such as infrastructure, open spaces, employment, local retail, heritage, culture, education, health and transport. We have a Professional Adviser, who is a retired Town Planner.

At the core of developing a NP is community engagement to create the vision for the future and thus the objectives of the NP. Therefore, the Parish Council needs the community's help in developing the Botley NP and we are looking actively for volunteers for a whole range of activities. You might be able to help by giving some time to:

- helping with data entry from surveys;
- · carrying out data analysis and drawing conclusions;
- carrying out topic specific research to help build the evidence base for the NP;
- assisting at and/or consulting with local groups at meetings
- assisting at and/or consulting with local residents at public exhibitions;
- proof reading and sense checking documents;
- questionnaire design
- any other area of expertise you have that you think would help develop our NP;
- helping with one of the 7 Working Groups (WGs), these being Communication, Economy, Education, Health, Housing, Infrastructure, Locality, and Transport, developing evidence and ideas to feed into the Botley NP. The WGs will be autonomous and expected to arrive at their recommendations by consensus before these are passed to the NP Committee for consideration, and;
- becoming a member of the NP Committee, when you would be involved in all aspects
  of the NP process and agreeing what recommendations to make to the Parish Council.
  Also, you might wish to join one or two of the WGs. The Parish Council feel the NP
  Committee should have at least 12 members and that no more than four of these should
  be Councillors.
